

NCCC IV – A few added rules. Read Them!

Rule #1. No Whining. Whiners will be dealt with severely.

Rule #2. Have Fun.

Rule #3, Be safe, not stupid.

Colors:

This morning you got 2 tickets, Yellow & Green. Yellow = prizes. No ticket, no prize.

Green = Food. No ticket, no food; end of the line, bring money.

There's a colored ribbon on the front of your boat; it signifies your flight and weigh-in time. Red, first flight - 3:00p weigh-in. White, second flight, 3:20p weigh-in. Blue, third flight, 3:40p weigh-in.

Launch:

Boats must drive by gas dock for running light, life jacket, and kill switch inspection. Stay in launch order and behind lead boat until you're out of the 5mph zone. The no-wake zone is also a no-passing zone. See Rule #3.

Off Limits:

Anglers must not fish within 50' of any operational gas docks or designated swim areas.

There is no fishing from a line perpendicular to the host marina property limits across the channel, bank to bank. See Rule #1

Fish:

The usual: A limit of 5 largemouth, smallmouth or spotted bass is in force. Each fish must exceed 13 inches in length. Yes, we'll swish the tail. There is to be no culling inside the off-limit area upon your return.

Too many fish? The limit's 5. That 6th fish is probably the smallest in your bag and it's coming out, along with the largest. **Fish over 5 pounds must be bagged separately.**

Returning:

Return on time. The colors, in order, are Red, White, and Blue. The color in front of you will have priority at check-in and weigh-in. Be on time; it's a pound-a-minute penalty – after 5 you're DQ'd.

Non-Boaters: Bag your fish on the way to the dock and prepare to disembark. Do not remove your fish prematurely. No more than 3 bags of fish will be in line at the scales. You will be told when to leave your boat for the scales. One angler only to the scales at a time. Hand your fish to the weigh-master, talk to the MC. Have fun with it. When you're done, the fish will go to the release boat; you should promptly retrieve your tow vehicle.

Boaters: Approach the dock from the south. Only 3 boats will be allowed at the dock at a time.

Drop off your non-boater and fish and begin a clockwise holding pattern while you wait for your non-boater to return with your tow vehicle. **Do not tie your boat up to the dock.** Be courteous to those behind you.

Your partner will be back shortly with the tow vehicle. If you are not ready when the tow vehicle is at the ramp, your tow vehicle will be directed to the end of the line. Keep moving.

Go Eat.
